

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FORMATTING ABSTRACTS OF YOUR PRESENTATION FOR THE 10TH ASIAN FORUM ON GRAPHIC SCIENCE 2015

To prepare abstracts, for the 10th Asian Forum on Graphic Science (AFGS 2015 Bangkok), in \LaTeX use the \LaTeX class file `afgsabs.cls`. Do not override or modify settings in this class file. This will ensure that all abstracts published in the proceedings will enjoy a uniform appearance. You can however include \LaTeX packages and macros that don't alter the appearance of your abstract.

The abstract must be an accurate precis of your proposed lecture (300 to 500 word long, maximum two pages including figures, in English only). This document must contain only the abstract title, authors and their affiliations, the abstract itself and keywords. Don't include a bibliography in the abstract. Omit footnote marks in the title if there is only one affiliation. A reasonable number of keywords, say three to six, is obligatory.

This paper itself is formatted according to all formatting rules. Use it as a model and edition template. This document is supplied as a \LaTeX -source file. We strongly suggest authors proceed by replacing the text of *this* file with their own.

Abstracts are to be submitted online via <https://www.easychair.org/conferences/?conf=afgs2015>. Upload the abstract files in the section titled "Upload Paper". There is also a mandatory "Abstract" field. You have to fill in some dummy text but we will ignore that field.

We will use your \LaTeX code for typesetting the book of abstract. Upload figures together with your \LaTeX source, if you want to include them in your abstract.
